

Monitoring and Evaluation support for EMIS Web E-SN Toolkit

Options to evaluate the activation and use of the E-SN.

The current functionalities within EMIS Web, means there are no perfect solutions but there are work arounds. These have been set out below.

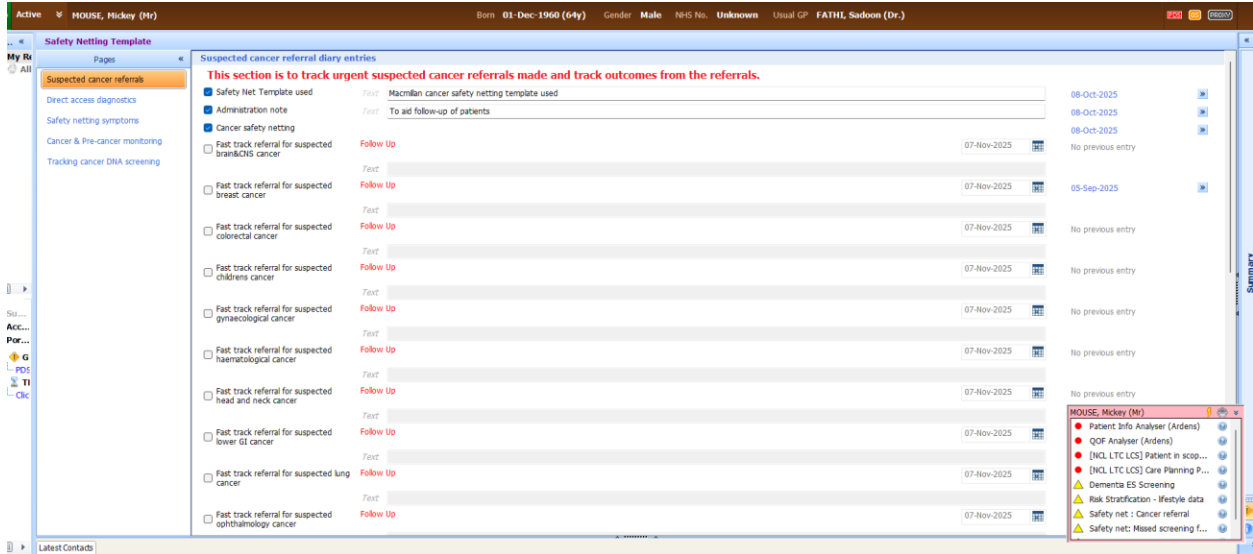
Process Measure 1: Activation of the template in EMIS Web.

This measure allows you to account for the number of times the template itself has been launched within EMIS Web itself. This has been done by building in to 'arbitrary' codes the template which auto code when the template is opened in the patient record and then saved. This will allow you to see how many times over a set period a primary care provider has launched the template. This does tell you who launched it or what they used it for.

To track this:

We have added 3 SNOMED codes that auto tick when the template is activated.

The text and SNOMED code terms for these items:

- o Safety Net Template used (Template entry)

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- o Administration note (Administration note)

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- o Cancer safety netting (Cancer safety netting)

Process Measure 2: Completion of Diary entries

The toolkit enables you to track timed activities. These are tagged to diary entries in EMIS Web which show up on the weekly(or however often they are run) reports (spreadsheets).

All the coded activities (e.g. referral for colonoscopy) are time tagged and will be shown on the spreadsheet when they are due(expired). To monitor this activity these spreadsheet need to be saved each time they are run and then reviewed across the period of time you are monitoring.

This information will allow you to see events that are coded and how long it took to complete them.
